

ABOUT WINSTON'S WISH

For over 30 years Winston's Wish has been helping children and young people whose worlds have been turned upside down by grief find hope for a brighter future.

Unlike adults, who stay with their grief, children often jump in and out of their grief. We describe this journey as 'puddle jumping'. This means that they may initially be upset about their loss but may then appear to be fine for a period of time and then become upset again, and so on. This can be very confusing both for children and the adults who care for them.

Conversations can allow children to express their emotions; be it sadness, anger, joy or fear. By opening up these important conversations about death we can allow children who are grieving to 'puddle jump' while understanding their mixed emotions.

JOIN THE WEAR WELLIES FUN

Then, why not try one of our welly-themed fundraising activities to help top up your totals:

All of a muddle fundraising quiz – Print out the enclosed quiz sheet and charge £1 to enter. Consider asking friends or local businesses to donate prizes.

Aim for the puddle welly wanging competition – Pay £1 to play. The person to throw a wellington boot the furthest, wins! Why not make it more challenging by filling the welly with water!

Make a splash, sponge your teacher or boss – Donate to throw a water soaked sponge at your teacher or boss.

Welly boot baking – Bake a selection of Welly Boot Biscuits, then sell them at a bake sale.

– could fund six live chat sessions with our bereavement support workers, giving young people the opportunity to share their feelings and find ways to cope.
